1. Numbers for meetings will be restricted to 40 people including the speaker.
2. Members must book their place by 6pm on the day before the meeting by phoning 01223 210724.
3. Meetings will be members only, we are still encouraging new members to join but they must have done so before the meeting. Membership will cost £5 for the 3 meetings in 2021.
4. Chairs will be spaced out individually. Chairs can be moved closer by those in the same household or bubble.
5. The library table will start at the January Meeting. For Covid Security returned books will be laid aside for 3 days.
6. To avoid crowding there will again not be a raffle or refreshments. (The Committee hopes to resume refreshments in February and the raffle in March.)
